Abstract: Contains a collection of materials owned by Carolyn Lutz, puppet aficionado and scholar, donated by Westhampton College after her death.

Administrative Information

Provenance: This collection contains materials donated by Westhampton College and the estate of Carolyn Lutz, puppet aficionado and scholar. Carolyn Lutz was the professor of English and History at Westhampton College (Richmond, VA), and helped bring American puppetry into international circles.

Processing History: Donated to CPA in 1986. Fully processed, including the creation of finding aid, completed in spring 2025.

Scope and Content Note: Contains how to guides on marionette building, performance and technique, stage and set design, hand written notes on puppetry styles and techniques, recommendations for books and music to use as performance pieces, articles on puppetry and global events primarily related to Scandinavian countries but also to several outliers (Japan, Bali, Mexico, USA), hand written notes from attendance at puppetry festivals, UNIMA booklets, Puppetry Festival booklets, Theatre and show playbills from around the world, and a decrepit photograph.
